Local Plan - Site SA45 - Land between Camlet Way and Crescent West, Hadley Wood

I have grown up in Hadley Wood and have lived here my whole life, I regularly walk along the fields off Bartrams Lane overlooking this land. This site is the heart of Hadley Wood, to destroy it would not only be killing our planet, destroying habitats and removing vital ecosystems but it would rob this neighbourhood of it's charming character which is a beautiful open space less than an hour away from central London.
