

I am writing to object to the following Policies:

- SP PL10, pages 80-87, and Figure 3.11;
- SP PL9, pages 77-80 and Concept Plan Figure 3.10;
- SA45: Land Between Camlet Way and Crescent Way, Hadley Wood, page 364;
- SA54, page 374;

I object to the proposed Policies on the following grounds:

- Common decency and a desire for considered improvement.
- These policies propose the de-designation of Green Belt for housing when there is significant areas of brownfield sites in Enfield that are better suited of redevelopment without the need to destroy valuable green belt land for ever.
- The sites listed are part of historic Enfield Chase, which is unique in the southeast and played an important role in the development of Enfield.
- The valuable landscape asset and its loss would cause permanent harm not only to the Green Belt, but also to the very character of the borough.
- Common sense

I am also objecting to the tall building policies on pages 156-160, Figure 7.3, Figure 7.4 and Policy DE6, and SA2 Palace Gardens Shopping Centre page 321 which propose areas for and the acceptable height of tall buildings which, in many cases would mar the landscape and are unnecessary because other lower-rise building forms could provide the same accommodation, as stated in the policy.

The poorly designed and executed existing town centre is crying out for a creative and beautiful solution but adding tower blocks is, in my opinion very lazy town planning and should be actively discouraged at all levels. It's time for this Enfield to provide a Town Centre its residents can be proud of rather than a one way system and poorly thought-out retail park.
