I am writing to register my very strong views and opposition to the proposed plane to erect several tower blocks and homes across the borough of Enfield. In addition to my views against the proposed plan, I am astounded by the fact this plan is being railroaded through without proper consultation with the residents of Enfield. I was initially highlighted to the plan by a friend and neighbor, when in fact it should have been the council informing me and all the other residents in the borough, of the plan.

The proposed plan highlights several locations across Enfield that have been earmarked to build tower blocks and houses. The majority of these areas are on greenbelt land or are existing businesses or facilities that will be torn down to make way for these additional dwellings.

Enfield Town is already a grossly overpopulated, to build the number of homes proposed in the plan, in whatever format, is simply madness and will ruin the town beyond all recognition. The council talk about preserving our heritage, well with this plan, our heritage will be lost forever. Our streets are currently rammed with commercial vehicles, this would quadruple should this plan go ahead, not to mention the hundreds of additional cars seeking parking.
